Get involved!

Hello Head Start families and welcome to the start of a great program year! As Chairperson for the Policy Council, I want to let you know about some of the amazing opportunities and resources available to you. If you have not attended a Parent Advisory Committee (PAC) meeting at your site, I urge you to go to the next one and really get involved. Each site is allocated a parent fund budget for activities or workshops based on your needs or interests. Use of the funds and topics can be discussed and voted on at your parent meetings. Along with the PAC meetings, there is another opportunity to be involved and that is the Policy Council (PC). If you are elected at your site to the PC, you will attend monthly meetings at the Preschool Services Department Administration Office where your input is used to make decisions on how the program runs. We vote on budget and curriculum, and discuss ways to improve the program. We also sit on interview panels to assist in the hiring of Head Start employees. Head Start also offers a free online High School diploma program, with support throughout the entire process and participation in a real graduation upon completion. If you are looking for a job and need somewhere to start, there is an apprenticeship program where you can be trained at a school site to gain experience to help you get a job. You can be trained as a custodian, food service worker, center clerk, or teacher's aide. While our kids are learning social emotional skills and school readiness during their time at Head Start, we as parents are given opportunities to learn as well. There are workshops offered for health/first aid, finance, family literacy, bullying, and parenting classes. If any of these resources sound like something you need, or if you have a need not mentioned here, please speak to the Generalist at your site, as they would love to help you. I hope you take advantage of all the opportunities and experiences offered to you during your time at Head Start. Hope to see you actively involved.

Fall Activity



DRDP Measures: PD4, LL2, LL3, REG4, SED 3

Materials: Construction paper, scissors, glue

1. Cut paper into 1/2 " strips. (You'll need plenty of orange, a few green, and one brown strip for each pumpkin.)

2. Cut one brown and a few green strips for each pumpkin that you plan to make.

3. Begin with the orange strips. With your child, roll each strip and secure the end with a bead of glue. Pinch the glued spot between your figures for 30 seconds or so. Don't try to make the curls all the same size. The pumpkins have a lot more character when the sizes are different.

4. Once you have made about thirty orange curls, lay them out to form a round-ish shape.

5. Glue the curls together, taking time again to pinch the pieces together for a few seconds to help the glue set.

6. Add a stem and a few green paper curls.
